KEYNOTE SPEAKER Morgan McArthur, DVM

University of Wisconsin Extension - New Berlin, WI



Dr. Morgan McArthur: Veterinarian. Connector. Speaker. Worm enthusiast. Artist. Auctioneer. His veterinary journey has been interesting, unconventional and rewarding. After graduating from Iowa State University with a DVM in 1983, Morgan came to Idaho. He prac-

ticed in Salmon for a short time and then relocated to Idaho Falls where he was a large animal practitioner until 1996. He got involved with a Toastmasters club in Idaho Falls because of a fear of public speaking. The organization created a monster. Propelled by a story that came out of veterinary practice, Morgan delivered a speech that won the World Championship of Public Speaking in 1994. Today Morgan plies his observational and communication skills as an educator for the University of Wisconsin Extension. He abides by the motto "If it isn't fun, it shouldn't be done!" Randy Acker, DVM

Sun Valley Animal Center - Sun Valley, ID
Dr. Randy Acker became the owner of the Sun Valley Animal Center after graduating from Colorado
State Univ. in 1979. Dr. Acker's focus has been in
canine surgery with a particular emphasis on canine orthopedics. In the early 1990's, Dr. Acker
began doing the Tibial Plateau Leveling Osteotomy
(TPLO) after learning the surgical technique from
Dr. Barclay Slocum who developed the TPLO. Dr.
Acker's interest in orthopedics has led him to multiple orthopedic patents and the development of the
TATE Elbow as well as an ankle replacement system. Dr. Acker lives in the valley with his wife and
